The K. Douglas Bowers Lectureship in Orthopaedics was established by Dr. Thomas S. and Jean Clark to honor the late orthopaedic surgeon. Dr. Bowers was team physician from 1967 to 1997. In that capacity, he oversaw the health care of WVU athletes in all sports. He graduated in 1959 from Jefferson Medical College of Thomas Jefferson University in Philadelphia and was the first resident to complete the orthopaedic training program at WVU Hospitals. Dr. Bowers was a partner with Morgantown Orthopedic Associates and was also a Clinical Professor of Orthopaedics in the WVU School of Medicine. This orthopaedic lectureship provides a lasting tribute to his memory.
