

PARTICIPANTS=66275, MEAN=3.52, STANDARD DEVIATION=7.16


1<sup>st</sup> PERCENTILE=0.15, MEDIAN=1.50, 99<sup>th</sup> PERCENTILE=28.00

### Reader's Guide to Understanding This Information:

Approximately 75% of females and 85% of males had CRP levels within the expected range. A higher proportion of women compared to men had elevated levels of CRP. CRP can be elevated due to an underlying, chronic inflammatory condition. CRP levels are also elevated in acute infection.
