Program Objective

"To expand access and provide quality psychiatric care to underserved areas of West Virginia."

The Department of Behavioral Medicine and Psychiatry, in conjunction with WVU Mountaineer Doctor Television (MDTV), currently operates 35 telepsychiatry clinics throughout the state of West Virginia. These clinics provide child and adolescent, adult, and addiction related psychiatric services to clients in fourteen counties with extensive catchment areas extending past county borders. Addiction related services also include provision of much needed care to pregnant mothers. Services have expanded to

include the education of rural clinic providers and psychiatry residents. Future plans for further expansion include provision of services to nursing homes, rural schools and teletherapy which are all designed to minimize usage of limited patient and local resources and maxim-

ize treatment potential for the future. 
