#### DAVID SHERRIS, MD

**Professor and Chairman Department of Otolaryngology University at Buffalo** State University of New York

Dr. Sherris received his medical degree from the University of Rochester where he also completed his otolaryngology residency training. He went on to then complete a fellowship in Facial Plastic Surgery at the University of Washington. For nearly a decade, Dr. Sherris was a staff physician at the prestigious Mayo Clinic. It was there that he held several prominent positions, including Chairman of the Facial Plastic Surgery Division and Associate Professor of the Department of Otorhinolaryngology. Today, Dr. Sherris is Professor and Chairman of the Department of Otolaryngology at The University at Buffalo where he started the Otolaryngology residency training program, the Gromo Institute for Research and Education, and The Clinic of Facial Plastic Surgery. Dr. Sherris also provides surgical care to under privileged patients throughout the world through the FACE to FACE program of the American Academy of Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery (AAFPRS). Dr. Sharris has won numerous awards for groundbreaking research, excellence in dedication and patient care, including the discovery of Botox for the use of improving scars. Since 2005, he has been awarded the "Best Doctors in America Award" annually, which is voted on by other doctors. Dr. Sherris has authored over 100 scientific publications and two textbooks, including Essential Surgical Skills, which teaches surgeons of all disciplines. For years, Dr. Sherris has served on various committees for the AAFPRS. In 2006, he was invited to ioin the Founder's Club, an exclusive club for the most experienced facial plastic surgeons. In 2010, he was voted to the Board of Directors of the AAFPRS.


