Organization Description

OHIP is a national program with training centers in the San Francisco Bay Area, Los Angeles, San Diego and New York City. We are a project of the Association of Occupational and Environmental Clinics (AOEC). Position Description

Students will work on teams to investigate a job-related problem identified by a group of workers. The purpose of OHIP is to provide an experiential learning process: students will learn about the field of occupational health and safety from the perspective of workers. Project work emphasizes worker interviews and worksite tours combined with research. Teams produce a final report to share with workers and other student teams. Commitment is full time for 8 weeks with possible evening or weekend meetings, depending on project.

Qualifications

Graduate and undergraduate students can apply; some stipend slots are restricted to U.S. citizens. Non-U.S. citizens must supply documentation of permission to work in the U.S. Undergraduates must have completed two years, preferably in a field related to public health, environmental studies, or public policy. Graduate students in public health, medicine and nursing encouraged to apply. We're looking for students with experience or interest in working with unions or social justice organizations, are organized and self-starting, good team skills, and ideally can speak a second language of new immigrant workers: Spanish, Mandarin, Korean, Vietnamese, etc. We encourage students from minority and recent immigrant groups to apply.

Compensation

Undergraduates = \$500/week stipend

Graduate, medical, nursing students = \$650/week. 8 week program
