RECOGNIZING MULTI-YEAR DONORS

As we reviewed the gifts and accomplishments of the year, we were awed to realize how many of our most generous donors have offered their support in prior years. Over 65% of our extraordinary friends this fiscal year (listed here) have given at a similar level both this year and in one or more years since the 2007 start of A State of Minds: The Campaign for West Virginia's University.

This medallion indicates feature stories on these special multi-year donors in the pages that follow.

The friends listed here each donated \$10,000 or more from July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013. Their gifts comprised nearly 87% of all private dollars to the WVU Health Sciences Center during this time period.

The two were married in June, 1944,
a month after Mrs. Curry graduated from WVU.

Because Ensign Curry had to report to the US Navy at
8 am the next day, the couple honeymooned on a day
coach to Cincinnati. He trained in Internal Medicine

at the Medical College of Virginia and the VA

Hospital in Richmond. Tizzie taught school that year,
earning \$116 a month; George got free room and board
at the hospital.

Today, Dr. and Mrs. Curry remain in Morgantown, along with two of their four children, but winter in Florida so George, 93, can play golf year-round. Son Dr. George A. Curry II, a 1972 WVU medicine grad, lives in Oklahoma City. "I decided in 10th grade to become a doctor," said the elder Dr. Curry. In 1935, a new antibacterial drug saved his oldest brother's life. "I thought medicine was a good career choice."

The George and Ethel Curry Medical
Scholarship was created as a way to give back. "I've

had lots of health problems. I got along so well each time I admired what the medical profession has done for me," he said.

Thanks to the couples' ongoing

philanthropy, numerous medical students have

benefited. Today's Curry Scholars are medical students

Claire Dolan and Brian Dilcher. Claire, a third year

medical student, is considering Med-Peds as a specialty.

In his second year, Brian says he is drawn to a career in

Emergency Medicine or Oncology.

"I wanted our scholarship to be in George's honor, too, for all the good he has done for others," said Tizzie, his wife of 70 years.





INVESTED IN WEST VIRGINIA

Loring Ross's dad had a plan for him. His father, an accountant, valued the independence and freedom that dentists in private practice seemed to possess. "As long as I can remember, he would cut out articles about dentists and leave them on my bed." So when Loring was drawn to the sciences, he turned to his father as mentor and guidance counselor. Dentistry was nearly a foregone conclusion, and there was little doubt what school Loring would attend —WVU.

The Ross family moved to West Virginia when

Loring was nearly two, and in Parkersburg, they found
their American dream. "You couldn't get into much

explains. Following his love of teaching, Loring's father left Dupont and became Dean of Business Services at Parkersburg Community College (now WVUP).

Loring spent two years at community college, then it was a smooth transition to WVU. "We were already so invested in West Virginia. I didn't apply to any other schools, and fortunately I was accepted to the School of Dentistry after just a year at WVU." Dr.

Ross received his Bachelor of Arts in 1975, his DDS in 1978, and his Master of Science in Orthodontics in 1980, all from WVU.

Dr. Ross and his wife, Young, made a recent \$100,000 gift to help fund the construction of a new building for WVU School of Dentistry. "Our fortunate way of life today comes out of those four years in dental school. Someone made it possible for me to go to school. We have to make it possible for the next generation. That's stewardship."

Ross is a member of the WVU Alumni

Association and the School of Dentistry Campaign

Committee, as well as the Woodburn Circle and Irvin

Stewart Societies.



A RISING TIDE

For alumnus Vince Anido, PhD, '75, '78, giving isn't just about providing monetary support. It is about making a significant impact on the lives of student pharmacists.

Dr. Anido, together with his wife Patty

Chambers Anido, established the Anido Family

Pharmacy Scholarship in the amount of \$50,000. The scholarship provides assistance to deserving students currently enrolled in the WVU School of Pharmacy.

"I wanted my gift to make an impact and be meaningful to students," Anido said. "My children, who are in their late 20's and early 30's, would tell me about their classmates who were struggling with debt during school and after graduation. My wife, Patty and I were fortunate that we were able to make sure our children didn't have those types of worries when they graduated and were starting their lives, so we want to do the same for student pharmacists."

"Vince has been extremely supportive of the School throughout my tenure as dean," said Patricia Chase, PhD, the Gates Wigner Dean of the WVU School of Pharmacy. "The cost of an education and student debt continues to rise, so scholarships like the Anido Family Pharmacy Scholarship play an even greater role in their ability to pursue their career goals. The impact this scholarship will have on a future pharmacist's life is immeasurable."

MURRAY SCHOLARSHIP

Established to honor the memory of William M. Murray and his devotion to public service and public health, the fund provides scholarship support to public health students like Chelsea Dunaway.

Chelsea is a second year MPH student who aspires to work in health policy. She is especially interested in mental health and in expanding access to health services in the Appalachian region. Though she had not heard of Bill Murray before she received she scholarship, she was quick to research him. "I'm honored to have been selected for this scholarship," Chelsea said. "The financial assistance from these generous donors has helped me pay for books and offsets my tuition expenses."

With Murray's administrative guidance and leadership, graduate public health education at West Virginia University was born and grew rapidly. The MPH program has achieved national certification, and attracted a growing stream of national and international applicants. Although the programs are only about a decade old, program graduates are successfully placed around the nation, and they are achieving leadership positions in state and federal agencies, in foundations and businesses, and in education. The William M. Murray Scholarship, established by retired WVU surgery chair, Gordon Murray, MD and his family in Bill's memory, was recently endowed and has been supported by 82 donors since its inception in 2007.

A LOYAL MOUNTAINEER

Betty Skaggs, PhD, '66, recently made a \$25,000 gift to the School of Nursing to create the Skaggs Family Dean's Special Projects Fund to support school activities. In today's economy with limited resources from state funds, this unrestricted gift is especially important to the school. This flexible funding can be used to recruit excellent faculty, fund student initiatives, and equip and renovate classrooms.

After receiving her BSN from WVU, Skaggs
began her nursing career at WVU Hospitals as a
pediatric nurse. She later worked at Baylor University
Medical Center and the University of Florida Health
Sciences Center. While in Florida she earned her

master's degree in nursing. Finally, as Director of the University of Texas School of Nursing Learning Center she administered a clinical simulation lab, a computer lab, an audio visual library, and learning enhancement service. During her career, Skaggs earned her PhD in curriculum and instruction from the UT Austin College of Education.

Because she values civic engagement as well as education, Skaggs has served on numerous boards and participated in many community organizations in Austin where she currently resides. Skaggs is also a life member of the WVU School of Nursing Alumni Association.

PIGMENT OF PROMISE

Spend 20 minutes with Rajesh Naz, PhD, and your mind will be humming with possibilities.

His lab looks like every other lab–off white walls, microscopes, pipettes, and of course, a few assistants. But his research promises to improve our understanding of fertility, and provide new avenues for safer, more effective forms of contraception.

Dr. Naz has published over 200 peer reviewed articles related to human reproduction. "Over 10% of infertility is caused by antibodies produced in either partner in an infertile couple," he explains while gesturing to a poster. Naz's research seeks to harness this dysfunctional response. So far, he has identified more than 10 genes which might trigger immune

reaction. These genes are being used to develop targeted contraceptive vaccines, which could have numerous benefits. Immunocontraception eliminates the health complications and environmental challenges attendant with hormonal birthcontrol. It can be used by men or women. In mammal models, contraceptive vaccines often require only a semiannual booster shot.

Naz, who acquired his PhD at the All India
Institute of Medical Sciences in New Delhi, India,
is also excited about the potential uses of curcumin
(diferuloyl methane)—the yellow pigment in turmeric,
a traditional Indian spice. While other scientists have

found that curcumin has antibacterial, antiviral, antiinflammatory, and anticancer properties, Naz is testing
curcumin as a contraception. In mouse models, the
antifertility effect was reversible.

Naz has been a professor at WVU since 2005 and has trained over 60 students, residents, and post-doctoral fellows, and over 130 undergraduate student workers. He has authored/edited 8 books and serves on the editorial boards of nine journals.

Exemplary research such as Dr. Naz's is being conducted in every clinical department at the School of Medicine. Private gifts for research today are more important than ever.



For the past 9 years, Dr. Farley and his wife,
Mary, have supported the Eastern Division of the
School of Medicine through the Emerson D. Farley Jr.,
MD and Mary Snider Farley Rural Medicine Support
Fund. Fund proceeds are used to encourage primary
care providers to locate in medically underserved areas
of West Virginia.

And for each of those years, the Farleys have been notified of the identity of one to three award recipients as well as their planned practice locations.

Farley likes that. "This lends accountability that the money is being spent the way I want!"

The Farleys grew up in Fairmont, WV. "Back then, no one had any more than anyone else. No one knew if they were poor," he explains. But after he graduated and left West Virginia, the disparities

became apparent. Primary care is a much needed skill in rural areas of West Virginia.

"To whom much is given, much will be required," Farley quotes. "We wanted to help our home state, West Virginia, so in 2004, we formed the Rural Medicine Support Fund and supplement it annually.

We have been blessed by giving."

HELPING SHAPE THE LIVES OF STUDENTS

His degree from the WVU School of

Pharmacy was the base of a successful career for Irvin

VanMeter, Jr., '53.

Mr. VanMeter, a native of Huntington, West Virginia, began his career in community pharmacy.

After 17 years in community practice, he worked for the next 25 years at the Charleston Area Medical

Center (CAMC). In 2000, he began a new job as an inspector for the West Virginia Board of Pharmacy, where he continues to work today.

With a career in which he practiced in both community and institutional settings, VanMeter knows the value and importance of future pharmacists obtaining a high level of education and professional development in order to become leaders in the profession of pharmacy.

"Having my pharmacy degree created a life that was good to me, for my family, and it opened a lot of doors for me," VanMeter said. "I wanted to be able to give back to the University in some way and help students."

It was with this sentiment in mind that

VanMeter decided to create The Irvin and Benita

VanMeter Pharmacy Scholarship. The scholarship is
awarded to an outstanding student who is a resident of

West Virginia, demonstrates financial need, and is in
good academic standing.

Current P-4 Adam Ferguson and current
P-3 Derek Wetsch were the first recipients of the
scholarship.

"I think it is great that alumni are creating scholarships," Ferguson said. "Not only does it help

current students, but it also shows how much they care about the profession and are willing to help shape the future."

Ferguson will graduate in May 2014, and he plans to complete a residency and pursue a career in clinical practice. Receiving one of the Irvin and Benita VanMeter Pharmacy Scholarships lightens his financial burdens, and he is able to concentrate fully on his final year of study and academic success.

"The scholarship has eased my financial worries," Ferguson said. "It has allowed me to not worry about finances and focus on my rotations. I feel honored and privileged to be a recipient of the scholarship."

Wetsch will graduate in May 2015. Like
Ferguson, he is also appreciative to have been chosen

as a scholarship recipient.

"To receive any scholarship is an honor because someone else has invested in your future,"

Wetsch said. "This help not only comes in financial means, but it also serves to motivate a recipient to let them know you are a worthy investment."

Receiving the Irvin and Benita VanMeter

Scholarship gave Wetsch a new realization about the full benefits of alumni scholarships.

"I am reminded that alumni were once students, too," he said. "They remember how it felt to be a student and are excited to help out the future of their profession. When alumni create scholarships, it sets the bar for the future of the profession, and it lets current students know that they will have the same opportunity to support other future students."

WVU nursing alumna Patricia Chambers Anido, MSN recently created the Anido Family Nursing Scholarship to support undergraduates in order to make a difference in the quality of life for nursing students. Patty graduated with a bachelor of science in nursing from WVU '76 and went on to receive her master's degree in nursing at the University of Kansas in 1981. She taught medical surgical nursing at Avila College in Kansas City, MO in the BSN program and also worked in the medical and surgical intensive care units at St. Joseph's Hospital there.

"Even though we no longer live in West Virginia, my husband Vince and I love the state and still feel a very close connection to the University. With this scholarship we hope to make a difference in the lives of nursing students by helping to relieve some of the stress that comes with paying college tuition," said Patty. Albert W. Young, MD, MPH, an intensivist/pulmonologist, and Kathy Young have established an endowment to provide scholarships for one or more deserving students at the WVU School of Medicine who demonstrate financial need and exceptional academic promise.

A graduate of Wah Yan College Kowloon, an Irish, Jesuit-run high school in Hong Kong, Dr. Young applied for admission to a number of American universities, "Fortunately for us," said Arthur J. Ross III, MD, MBA, Dean of the School of Medicine, "West Virginia University was the first to respond."

A gifted student at the undergraduate level, Albert applied to the School of Medicine after only three years at WVU and was accepted, graduating in '71. He completed his residency and fellowship training at the University of Southern California and later earned a Masters degree in Public Health from UCLA. In addition to his philanthropic support, Dr. Young serves as chair of the WVU School of Medicine's A State of Minds Campaign Committee and is a member of the School's Visiting Committee, where he works alongside others to advance the School's mission to improve the lives of the people of West Virginia and beyond. "Morgantown, West Virginia, is my hometown in America," he said.




OPPORTUNITY FOR SIGHT
