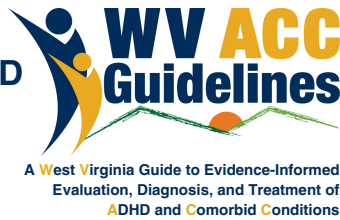

In addition to his current responsibilities that include teaching, supervising, and conducting research, Dr. Perle provides both face-to-face and virtual psychological care. While treating a wide-range of presenting concerns, Dr. Perle holds a specialization in the assessment and treatment of childhood ADHD and disruptive behavior disorders.
